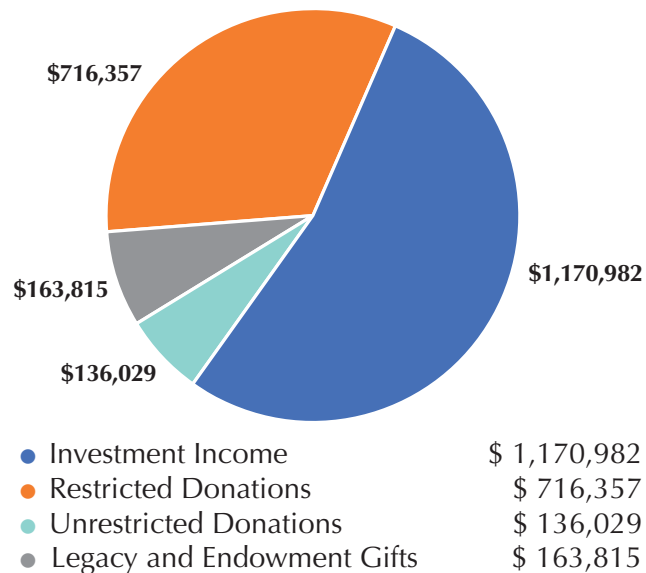

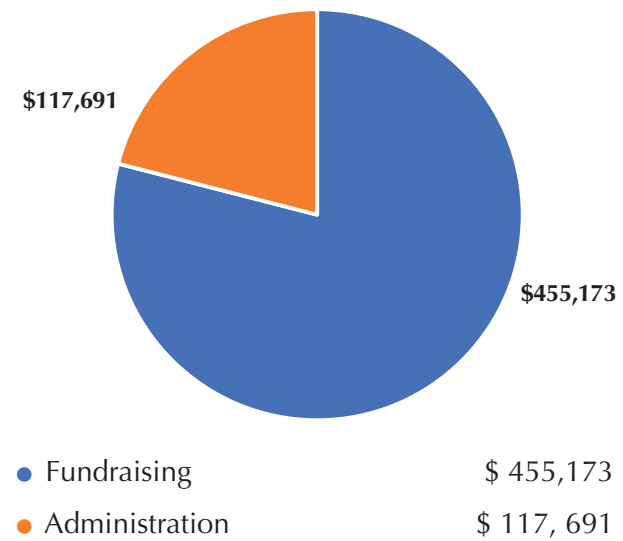

### BRIDGING EXCELLENCE

Thanks to donors, clinicians at Horizon's Dr. Everett Chalmers Regional Hospital (DECRH) have **\$610,000** of new equipment, including:

- Portable ultrasound machine for Orthopedics
- Holmium Yag Laser for the Urology department
- Gamma Detection Probe for diagnosis and treating patients with breast cancer
- State-of-the-art ventilated cabinets for drying and storage of endoscopes for the GI Lab
- A High-resolution Impedance Motility Catheter to diagnose source causing pain in the esophagus
- An ENT Navigation System for surgeons to use when doing sinus surgeries

This new equipment vastly improves patient care and reduces wait times.

#### GIVING HEARTS : A COVID-19 SUPPORT FUND

Faced with a once-in-a-century health emergency with COVID-19, the Giving Hearts Fund has already been used to purchase life-saving equipment such as:



- Two chest compression devices which are an easy-to-use mechanical tool for sudden cardiac arrest patients
- 11 iPads for patients isolated from family and friends and 15 iPads for the mobile crisis mental health teams in western New Brunswick
